The Darwin T. Turner Scholars Program, offers to promote academic excellence, foster diversity, and provide leadership opportunities to incoming students, through service, scholarship and success.





PR1ZE

The PR1ZE Mentoring Program (Putting Retention 1st in the Zest for Excellence) is a faculty and administration support program for historically underrepresented minority students, particularly focusing on African American students. The program began in the College of Arts and Sciences. In 2010, the program expanded to include students universitywide.

Annual Women's Center Awards Ceremony


 Recognition of women student leaders, faculty and staff, and UC programs/departments who advance gender equity and social justice
