Every year

Regularly attend career events hosted by UC, including workshops, employer sessions, and career fairs.

First Year

- Activate your <u>Handshake</u> account. Handshake is UC's career platform.
- Attend the <u>Part-Time Job Fair</u> and utilize Handshake, to apply to on-campus and local part-time jobs.
- □ Join <u>campus clubs</u>, <u>organizations</u>, and pursue volunteer opportunities that interest you
- Visit the <u>Career Studio</u>, located in TUC 310, to meet your career coach, get feedback on your resume, or attend a workshop.
- Complete <u>career assessments</u> to explore your values, skills, interests, and personality type
- ☐ Read the What Can I Do With A Major In...? pages to discover possible career options
- Interested in pursuing professional school (medical, dental, law school, etc.)? Meet with the Pre-Professional Advising Center (PPAC).
- Create a LinkedIn and <u>Bearcats Connect</u> account.
 Upload your free professional headshot from the
 Career Studio, fill out your profile, and connect with family members, professors, classmates, etc.

Sophomore Year

- Meet with your career coach to develop your career plan and explore how you can get experience through co-ops, internships, research, service learning, UC Forward, and more as a UC student.
- □ Identify interesting careers. Meet with people to learn about their work in informational interviews.
- □ Update your resume to include summer jobs, extracurricular activities, etc.
- Attend career events with employers, such as career fairs, information sessions, tabling and networking events, workshops, etc.
- Search and apply for internships, co-ops, etc. in Handshake. Start early as you may need to apply to 30-100+ opportunities. Also, notify your LinkedIn network that you are seeking an opportunity and ask for referrals to positions and people that you should connect with.
- □ Schedule a mock interview with a career coach or conduct one virtually through Big Interview
- ☐ Take on leadership roles within your favorite clubs and organizations
- ☐ Talk to your professors and build relationships
- □ Explore study abroad and international experiential learning opportunities.

Junior Year

- Schedule a career coaching appointment to discuss your career plans
- Update your resume to include your college experiences (generally high school experiences begin to move off your resume at this point)
- Connect with people you met through co-ops, internships, and part-time jobs as well as through clubs and classes on LinkedIn and <u>Bearcats Connect</u>.
- □ Use Handshake to search and apply for internships, co-ops, etc. Start early as you may need to apply to 30-100+ opportunities.
- ☐ Continue developing skills and experiences through leadership positions in clubs and organizations
- ☐ Engage in <u>study abroad</u> and <u>international</u> <u>experiential learning opportunities.</u>
- ☐ If you are considering Graduate School, talk with professors or meet with your career coach to discuss the process and ask questions.
- Study for graduate school entrance exams (GRE, GMAT, etc.) and take practice tests.

Senior Year

- Meet with your career coach to finalize your resume and/or graduate school documents.
- Begin applying to jobs on Handshake, LinkedIn, Indeed and through individual company websites as early as possible. Expect that you may need to apply to 30-100+ opportunities and that the hiring process can take several months from application to offer.
- Attend <u>career fairs and employer information</u>
 <u>sessions</u> to find opportunities and to network with
 recruiters. This allows you to make a strong first
 impression and can give you an advantage in the
 application process.
- Notify your LinkedIn network of the types of opportunities you are seeking and ask for referrals to positions or people that you should connect with.
- ☐ If pursuing graduate school, take entrance exams, secure letters of recommendation, write your personal statement, and submit your application.
- Schedule a mock interview with a career coach or conduct one virtually through <u>Big Interview</u>
- Notify your network when you have finalized your post-graduation plans and thank those that helped you along the way.
